

I'm happy to suggest a Barolo wine tour. Below is a suggested itinerary tailored to your request. This itinerary focuses on a day trip from Milan, exploring the renowned Langhe region and its famous wineries, while keeping the experience enjoyable and manageable within a typical day-tour timeframe.

Suggested Itinerary: Barolo Wine Tour for 2 – 6 People

Duration: Approximately 10-12 hours (8:00 AM - 6:00 PM)

Starting Point: Milan

Group Size: 2 - 6 people

Morning: Departure from Milan and Travel to Langhe

8:00 AM - 10:30 AM: Depart from Milan. The drive to the Langhe region, home to Barolo, is about 140-150 km (2-2.5 hours), depending on traffic. Enjoy the scenic route through the Piedmont countryside.

Tip: Start early to maximize your time at the wineries and avoid midday heat.

Late Morning: First Winery Visit

10:30 AM - 12:30 PM: Arrive in the Barolo area and visit a renowned winery, such as **Marchesi di Barolo**. Spend about 2 hours on a guided tour of the vineyards and cellars, learning about the winemaking process, followed by a tasting of their signature Barolo wines.

Activity: Enjoy 3-4 wine samples paired with local snacks (e.g., cheese or bread).

Afternoon: Second Winery and Lunch

12:30 PM - 2:30 PM: Travel 10-15 km (20-30 minutes) to another winery, such as **Pio Cesare** in Alba. Spend 1 hour on a tour and tasting, focusing on different Barolo vintages.

2:30 PM - 3:30 PM: Have lunch at a nearby trattoria or winery restaurant, savoring Piedmontese dishes like agnolotti or vitello tonnato, which complement the wines.

Note: Allow time to relax and digest, as wine tastings can be intense.

Afternoon: Exploration and Third Winery

3:30 PM - 5:00 PM: Drive 15-20 km (30 minutes) to a third winery, such as a smaller estate like **Giacomo Fenocchio**, known for traditional Barolo production. Enjoy a 1.5-hour visit with a tasting of their unique offerings.

Evening: Return to Milan

5:00 PM - 7:00 PM: Depart from the Langhe region and drive back to Milan (2-2.5 hours). Arrive by 7:00 PM, concluding your day.

How to Book Your Barolo Wine Tour

To secure your Barolo wine tasting on June 13, 2025, it is important to book and pay in advance for the wine tasting places, since after Covid, all the wineries access small groups only.

The tour includes a private driver, luxury vehicle, and guided winery visits with tastings. The focus is on Barolo and possibly Barbaresco wines, showcasing Piedmont's heritage.

Preparation: Wear comfortable shoes for vineyard walks and bring a light jacket, as temperatures may vary. Consider a small purchase limit for wine bottles if interested.

Customization: You can request stops in charming towns like Alba (15 km from Barolo) to explore truffles or local markets, adding variety to your day.

This plan offers a balanced mix of travel (4.5-5 hours in total), winery visits (4.5-5 hours), and meal breaks, fitting within 10-12 hours. Visiting 2-3 wineries allows you to experience the diversity of Barolo while leaving room for enjoyment. The private tour ensures flexibility to adjust based on your pace.
